



Credential Requirements:

Provided is a brief overview of the requirements, see the web site for full details.

- The VTS (Nutrition) must be a graduate of an AVMA approved Veterinary Technician program and/or credentialed to practice as a Veterinary Technician in some State or Province of the United States, Canada, or other country.
- Three years of nutrition experience, must be 75% of your time, a minimum of 4,000 hrs. All experience must be completed within three years prior to the application.
- Membership in NAVTA required
- E-mail of intent submitted to Nutritiontechs@aol.com at the start of the third year.
- A minimum of forty (40) continuing education (CE) hours. At least 10 hours the year the application is submitted.
- Completion of the Veterinary Nutrition Technician Skills Form.
- Clinical- A minimum of forty (40) cases (clinical) must be recorded, or Research- One (1) year within the three (3) years immediately preceding application.
- Five (5) detailed case reports.
- Two (2) letters of recommendations.
